Successful CVs

Before you start

Your CV is your personal marketing document and should be a clear and structured summary of your: education, employment, experience, skills and interests that are relevant to the position.

There is no point sending your CV for a job without adapting it to the requirements of each job, the number#1 piece of advice employers give us is that they want to see you have read and understood the job description and have modified your CV accordingly.

First read the job description/person specification/essential criteria and identify what the employer is looking for, including:

- Skills
- Knowledge
- Experience
- Qualifications
- Qualities

If this is not explicit in the job advert, then do your research - look at similar job roles/previous adverts.

Next gather your evidence from everything you have done so far including;

- Sports
- University
- Clubs & Societies
- Work experience & Internships
- Part-time jobs
- Volunteering
- University projects

Then identify which aspect of your life demonstrates each skill to the best effect

- remember to use your strongest evidence for each criteria.

What to include in your CV

There are many different styles and design formats that you can use for writing CVs. How you present the content and layout of your CV will depend entirely on the vacancy you are applying for; however, the following

sections are normally included:

- Contact Details: Name, address or location (be mindful if posting your CV to a public Jobs Board), email, phone number and link to your LinkedIn page (if appropriate) - this is all you need, unless otherwise specified.
- Profile or Career Aim: If you do include a profile, be succinct, interesting and outline your key relevant skills, experiences and motivations. No more than 3 or 4 lines and think of it as a snapshot of yourself; who you are, what you bring and what you want, avoid being generic.
- Education: A summary of your education in reverse chronological order (most recent first). Include start and finish dates, (even if still to finish), the official name of your course, your predicted or actual grade and the name of the institution. Remember that university projects, coursework or Graded Units at college that involve applying your knowledge to real problems, completing research tasks, working in teams and making presentations can all be used to show that you have the skills that employers want. If you have done a number of relevant projects over the years, you could have a subsection here entitled "Project Experience" where you could expand on what you did - this might be a good idea if you do not have relevant work experience. Don't forget to include any practical skills learnt from lab or field-work or time spent studying abroad. If you have used particular technical skills or software to achieve your coursework or during your work experience, also mention them. You do not always have to include school qualifications in this section, check employer requirements.
- Experience: Remember, the more relevant the experience the bigger the space and the better its position on your CV. Otherwise stick with reverse chronological order. Include start and if relevant, finish dates, your job title and the name of the organisation. You do not need to include every job; it may be

- more appropriate to group them within a specific date range. To attract the employers' attention to your most relevant experience, it may be appropriate to subdivide your experience into different sections such as Relevant Experience; Further Experience; Volunteering etc.
- What comes next depends on what the job is looking for You could include headings such as Technical Skills, Key Skills, Extra Curricular Activities, Leadership Experience, Professional Accreditation, Continuing Professional Development or Interests, if they're interesting. Alternatively, you could include a catch all final section called Additional Information, where you can include some of the above as well as things like language skills and driving licence status.
- References: Most employers looking to hire new graduates will require two referees: one academic and one professional. It is usual to use "References available on request" but be sure to have all the contact details and their permission at the ready when the employer asks for them.

You will find a variety of example CVs on the following pages; use these as a guide only, this is your CV so make sure you use it to market yourself effectively for each role. We would recommend avoiding CV templates, as employers are not impressed with identical CV formats, and they are not as flexible as starting with a blank Word document.

It is important to use positive language and we have included a section on this at the end. Finally, a GCU Careers Adviser can help you to review your CV BEFORE you send it to an employer – you can book an appointment on our website and check our blog to find out about CV Drop-in sessions



Use Positive Language (Active or Action Verbs)

These create a strong impression of achievement, ability and activity. For example, rather than "I was a class representative" you could write "Elected class representative by my peers, collected and reported their views at formal staff/student consultative meetings"

Be specific and quantify your achievements, if you put together a social media campaign to promote a fundraising event, demonstrate your impact, did you increase engagement, impact attendance or raise more money? For example, rather than "Organised the venue for the graduation dinner" you could write "Negotiated a discount with the venue, saving £600."
