Our Chancellor

Professor Anne-Marie Imafidon MBE HonFREng HonFBSA HonFIET

One of the UK's most influential women in tech and a leading advocate of diversifying talent in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM), Professor Anne-Marie Imafidon MBE was appointed Chancellor of Glasgow Caledonian University in 2024.

Professor Imafidon is a trailblazer in the fields of business, mathematics and technology, and has received a host of accolades including an MBE in 2017 for her services to young women and the STEM fields. She was named the UK IT Industry and British Computer Society's Young IT Professional of the Year in 2013, and, in 2020, the UK's Most Influential Woman in Tech by *Computer Weekly*, the same year she was appointed a NATO2030 Young Leader. In 2021 she began a run as temporary Arithmetician for 60 episodes of Channel 4's *Countdown*, the world's longest-running game show.

As co-founder of the award-winning organisation Stemettes, Professor Imafidon has spearheaded initiatives to inspire the next generation of girls and young women in STEM careers, reaching more than 73,000 young people across the UK, and Europe.

Alongside Science, Innovation and Technology Secretary, The Rt Hon Liz Kendall MP, Professor Imafidon leads Women in Tech, a UK Government taskforce designed to ensure women "enter, stay in and lead" the country's technology sector, and she chairs the Institute for the Future of Work, an independent research and development body exploring how new technologies are transforming our working lives.

A sought-after presenter, keynote speaker and adviser, she continues to make significant contributions to the advancement of women in technology, and, in 2022, wrote *She's in CTRL*, *Transworld*, a guide to women's empowerment through digital literacy. Professor Imafidon is both Chancellor and Honorary Professor of the University, though her remarkable learning journey also includes passing GCSEs at the age of 10, becoming the youngest girl to pass A-level computing at 11, and earning a Master's degree in Mathematics and Computer Science from the University of Oxford aged just 20. Professor Imafidon embodies our University Values: confidence, creativity, integrity and responsibility.





Graduation ceremony

The celebration is a blend of old and new traditions.

Your graduation ceremony is a blend of centuries of academic history woven with the University's own traditions.

The ceremony draws together our community to mark the award of degrees or other achievements and celebrate your success with pride as you reach a milestone in your journey with us. It begins with the academic anthem, *Gaudeamus Igitur* (*Let Us Rejoice*), and graduands (students about to have their degrees conferred) and their guests stand as the academic procession enters. The procession usually includes our Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor, Vice-Principals, senior staff, members of the University Court and Senate, distinguished honorary graduands and the Bedellus.

The Bedellus carries the Caledonian Mace - the symbol of our independence and authority to confer degrees. Ceremonial maces' roots can be traced to the Middle Ages when they would be used as weapons to protect the monarch and, subsequently, university leaders. Our richly decorated ceremonial Mace celebrates our motto, For the Common Weal, and was designed

by The Glasgow School of Art and gifted by the universities of Glasgow and Strathclyde. The Mace was the first to be produced in Scotland for a Scottish university in more than 100 years.

Degrees are conferred, or awarded, by our Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor (our Principal and executive head of the University), or by our Chair of Court - our supreme governing body.

Our students are presented by the Dean, the most senior academic of each of our Schools, and are then capped - signifying that your degree has been awarded and you are now a graduate. The award given to each graduating student is based on the level of their study and their course (there's a guide to our degrees and the academic dress associated with them on the page opposite).

Alongside our own students, we also award honorary degrees to public figures who embody our Values in recognition of their outstanding achievements in their sphere. The ceremony usually closes with an address from the Principal and Vice-Chancellor.





Graduation robes

Glasgow Caledonian University's hoods and robes reflect the variety and diversity of our academic programmes.

The origins of today's academic dress – including the robe and hood worn by our students – can be traced back to medieval Europe's earliest universities when students adopted long, sober clothing to reflect their scholarly status. While every-day fashions have changed, the often flamboyantly coloured robes have remained an integral part of academic ceremonies – undoubtedly adding to the sense of occasion at graduation.

The introduction, in 2010, of the various richly hued graduation robes and hoods that are associated with each of our degrees was a landmark in our

history and illustrates our pride in our past and present, and in our ambitions for the future. The coloured hoods associated with each degree – illustrated above – replaced the uniform academic dress that had remained unchanged since we were awarded university status in 1993 and celebrate the diversity of achievement of our 21st-century graduates who come from all over the world.

Members of our academic procession wear the academic dress associated with the university from which they graduated, creating the vibrant variety of colours you'll see at today's ceremony.

Award of Honorary Degree of Doctor of Business Administration

Glasgow Caledonian Honorary Professor Jane Shepherdson CBE has been described as the most influential person on the British high street.

Chair of the UK's leading luxury-fashion rental platform My Wardrobe HQ, and Director of London Fashion Fund, Jane was awarded a CBE for services to UK retail business in 2015.

Jane's career in fashion began in 1984 when she joined Topshop, transforming the high-street retailer into a leading global design brand. By the time she left in 2007, she had increased its profits from £9m to £110m.

She then joined Fairtrade pioneer Peopletree, and worked with Oxfam as Creative Advisor, helping to transform the charity's customer experience. Jane spearheaded a management buy-in of Whistles, becoming its CEO in 2008, where she rejuvenated the fashion brand before stepping down in 2016.

Jane is a passionate advocate of sustainable fashion and, in 2015, was awarded an honorary professorship by Glasgow Caledonian University's British School of Fashion, in recognition of her contribution to the industry. She has been a member of the Glasgow Caledonian Fashion Advisory Board since its foundation in 2023.

A champion of the University's fledgling fashion-business leaders, she has shared her expertise in masterclasses and spoken at our London graduation ceremonies. Last year, she joined our Fashion Showcase, interviewing students about their work and offering her support in growing a career in fashion and retailing.

Jane is also a Trustee and volunteer at Smartworks, a charity that uses fashion as a force for good by helping women find employment and turn their lives around.

Award of Honorary Degree of Doctor of Letters

Glasgow Caledonian University alumnus Callum Baird is Editor-in-Chief of Newsquest Scotland, the home of iconic newspapers including *The Herald*, *The Glasgow Times* and *The National*.

Callum joined Newsquest, the UK's second biggest publisher of regional and local newspapers and part of one of the world's largest and most respected media groups, in 2013 – the same year he graduated with an MA Multimedia Journalism from Glasgow Caledonian.

He began his career in journalism as a sports reporter for *The Herald* and was key in the launch of Scotland's only pro-independence newspaper, *The National*, in 2014.

Callum was promoted to the paper's Deputy Editor in the same year, and to Editor in 2015. He became Editor-in-Chief at Newsquest Scotland in 2022.

Bucking a global decline in the sector, under his stewardship Newsquest Scotland has established new newspapers and sports news sites and grown revenue through the innovative introduction of

paywalls and newsletters. Newsquest Scotland now has more than 55,000 paying subscribers to its news titles.

Callum is a passionate supporter of the next generation of talented journalists and, as well as sharing his experience with students on our journalism and media courses, he has created valuable work experience opportunities with Newsquest papers including *The Herald*, *The National*, *Sunday National*, *Glasgow Times*, *Dunfermline Press*, *Greenock Telegraph*, *Cumnock Chronicle*, *Ayrshire Weekly Press*, and *The Ardrossan and Saltcoats Herald*.

Many of our graduates have gone on to join the 160 journalists employed by Newsquest Scotland across the country.

In 2023, Callum was named our GCU Alumni of the Year in recognition of his outstanding achievements. Callum was named Newsquest Editor of the Year in 2016 and parent company Gannett's Greatest Accelerator in 2022.
