

What difference has the project made?		
The pilot project helped mitigate immediate and long-term issues related to various problems reported by NHSGGC maternity service users. Issues raised by service users included transport to and from onsite appointments, food and fuel poverty, childcare and the cost-of-living crisis. The project allows NHSGGC to identify maternity secondary care service users who are in socioeconomic crisis. Through the provision of immediate financial and material help, long-term support needs can be identified and provisions put into place to aid service users.
